

Washington D.C. Market Radio Changes Fact Sheet

On January 4, 2006, Bonneville International announced a series of changes to better meet the news, information and classical music needs of radio listeners in the Washington, D.C. community. Below is an outline of the changes announced by Bonneville:

- WTOP, 24-Hour News Station
 - o Currently on 1500 AM and 107.7 FM
 - Beginning at noon on January 4, 2006, WTOP's new permanent frequency will be 103.5 FM
 - o It will be temporarily simulcast on 103.5 FM, 1500 AM and 107.7 FM until the new Washington Post Radio station is launched
- WGMS, Classical Music Station
 - o Currently on 103.5 FM
 - o After January 4, 2006, WGMS' new permanent frequencies will be 104.1 and 103.9 FM replacing Z104
 - o 103.9 FM's signal is being upgraded to widen its coverage
- Washington Post Radio, in-depth news and the Washington Nationals
 - o Bonneville will own and operate both WTOP and Washington Post Radio
 - o Washington Post has been invited to provide content for the new station
 - o The new station will be launched late March 2006
 - o Washington Post Radio will be heard on 1500 AM and 107.7 FM
- New HD Radio Stations
 - o Bonneville has launched two new classical stations that will be broadcast digitally using HD Radio™ technology
 - o One station will play traditional classical music like that played on WGMS, but will feature more in-depth programming
 - o The other will be an on-air broadcast of the web-based opera and choral music station, Viva La Voce
